

⁹ You, however, are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God lives in you. But if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Him.

"Our desperate need is not a new organization or a new movement or a new method—we have enough of these. I believe that the greatest need is that men and women who profess the name of Jesus Christ be filled with the Spirit. If you are not filled with the Spirit, you are sinning against God. You have no victory in your life, no joy, no thrill, no brilliancy."

"I am convinced that to be filled with the Spirit is not an option, but a necessity. It is indispensable for the abundant life and for fruitful service. The Spirit-filled life is not abnormal; it is the normal Christian life. Anything less is subnormal; it is less than what God wants and provides for His children.

Therefore, to be filled with the Spirit should never be thought of as an unusual or unique experience for, or known by, only a select few. It is intended for all, needed by all, and available to all."

2. It is a transformational in nature

2 Cor. 5:17

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV) Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. 1 Peter 2:2 (NKJV) as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby,

Three things occur when a person is SPIRE

3. It has an observable effect

Mat. 5:16, Jn. 13:35

Ephesians 5:18 (KJV) ¹⁸ And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit;

Ephesians 5:18 (HCSB) ¹⁸ And don't get drunk with wine, which [leads to] reckless actions, but be filled by the Spirit: **Ephesians 5:18-19 (GW)** ¹⁸ Don't get drunk on wine, which leads to wild living. Instead, be filled with the Spirit. **Ephesians 5:18 (TLB)** ¹⁸ Don't drink too much wine, for many evils lie along that path; be filled instead with the Holy Spirit and controlled by him.

Ephesians 5:1-20 (NLT)

¹ Imitate God, therefore, in everything you do, because you are his dear children. ² Live a life filled with love, following the example of Christ. He loved us and offered himself as a sacrifice for us, a pleasing aroma to God.³ Let there be no sexual immorality, impurity, or greed among you. Such sins have no place among God's people.⁴ Obscene stories, foolish talk, and coarse jokes—these are not for you. Instead, let there be thankfulness to God. ⁵ You can be sure that no immoral, impure, or greedy person will inherit the Kingdom of Christ and of God. For a greedy person is an idolater, worshiping the things of this world. ⁶ Don't be fooled by those who try to excuse these sins, for the anger of God will fall on all who disobey him. ⁷ Don't participate in the things these people do. ⁸ For once you were full of darkness, but now you have light from the Lord. So live as people of light! ⁹ For this light within you produces only what is good and right and true. ¹⁰ Carefully determine what pleases the Lord. ¹¹ Take no part in the worthless deeds of evil and darkness; instead, expose them. ¹² It is shameful even to talk about the things that ungodly people do in secret. ¹³ But their evil intentions will be exposed when the light shines on them, ¹⁴ for the light makes everything visible. This is why it is said, "Awake, O sleeper, rise up from the dead, and Christ will give you light." ¹⁵ So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. ¹⁶ Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. ¹⁷ Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do. ¹⁸ Don't be drunk with wine, because that will ruin your life. Instead, be filled with the Holy Spirit, ¹⁹ singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, and making music to the Lord in your hearts. ²⁰ And give thanks for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I. What does it mean to be filled with the Holy Spirit?



Acts 1:5 (NKJV) ...you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

Four aspects on the verb "be filled" in Ephesians 5:18





 It is stated in the imperative mood. Paul did not suggest, recommend, or utter a polite piece of advice; rather he commanded it.



 It is in the plural form. That means that every Christian must be filled with the Spirit. The fullness of the Spirit applies to all God's people, not to a favored few.



• It is in the passive voice. It is not the believer that does the filling, rather God Himself. The believer simply receives the filling of the Holy Spirit. We make ourselves available to His filling. As we yield ourselves to the Spirit's control, He fills us with His power and presence.



 It is in the present tense, meaning that being filled with the Spirit is to be a continuous experience. We are filled once for all, like a bucket. Instead, we are to be filled constantly. It might be translated, "Be filled and keep on being filled," or "Be being filled."
