"Publicans and Sinners" (See Matthew 9:10, John 4:35)

"Publicans and Sinners"

They are associated in the New Testament with prostitutes (Matthew 21:32), extortionists, the unjust, adulterers (Luke 18:11) and Gentiles (Matthew 18:17).

John the Baptist told these tax-collectors that they needed to repent of this practice (Luke 3:12-13).

"Publicans and Sinners"

Leviticus 25:36 (NKJV)

Take no usury or interest from him; but fear your God, that your brother may live with you.
