

# Right Motives

A fast is a concerted period of self-denial, demonstrating an increasing devotion to and humility before God. In the case of a fast involving food, the hunger within you reminds you of your desire to truly focus upon the will of God and doing it. In essence a fast is a denial of anything that facilitates the denial of the flesh and the promotion of the spirit. It is an concerted effort to subdue the flesh and to promote the spirit of God within you.


