

Seven Reasons to Believe That Christ Rose From the Dead 1 Corinthians 15:1-9



1. A Public Execution Assured That He Actually Died



Matthew 27:50 (NKJV) ⁵⁰ And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and <u>yielded up His spirit</u>.

John 19:30 (NKJV)

³⁰ So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, <u>He gave up His spirit</u>.



John 19:33-34 (NKJV)

³³ But when they came to Jesus and <u>saw that He was already dead</u>, they did not break His legs. ³⁴ But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.



Mark 15:43-45 (NKJV)


⁴³Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. ⁴⁴ Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. ⁴⁵ So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph.




2. High Officials Secured the Gravesite



⁶²On the next day, which followed the Day of Preparation, the chief priests and Pharisees gathered together to Pilate, ⁶³ saying, "Sir, we remember, while He was still alive, how that deceiver said, 'After three days I will rise.' 64 Therefore command that the tomb be made secure until the third day, lest His disciples come by night and steal Him away, and say to the people, 'He has risen from the dead.' So the last deception will be worse than the first." ⁶⁵ Pilate said to them, "You have a guard; go your way, make *it* as secure as you know how." 66 So they went and made the tomb secure, sealing the stone and setting the guard.



3. The Grave Was Found Empty



The resurrection proclamation could not have been maintained in Jerusalem for a single day, for a single hour, if the emptiness of the tomb had not been established as a fact.



Mark 16:5-6 (NKJV)

⁵And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. ⁶ But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him.



John 20:6-8 (NKJV)

⁶Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; and he saw the linen cloths lying *there*, ⁷ and the handkerchief that had been around His head, not lying with the linen cloths, <u>but folded together in a</u> <u>place by itself</u>. ⁸Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also; and he saw and believed.

Matthew 28:11-15 (NKJV)

¹¹Now while they were going, behold, some of the guard came into the city and reported to the chief priests all the things that had happened. ¹² When they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, <u>they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers</u>, ¹³ saying, "Tell them, 'His <u>disciples came at night and stole Him *away* while we slept.' ¹⁴ And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will appease him and make you secure." ¹⁵ So they took the money and did as they were instructed; and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day.</u>





We are faced with two facts.

(1) Jesus died and was buried.(2) In a short time, His tomb became empty.




4. Many People Claimed to Have Seen Him Alive

1 Corinthians 15:5-8 (NKJV)

⁵and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. ⁶ After that He was <u>seen by over five hundred brethren at once</u>, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep. ⁷ After that He was <u>seen by James</u>, then <u>by all the apostles</u>. ⁸ Then last of all He was <u>seen by me also</u>, as by one born out of due time.

Mary Magdalene (John 20:11-18), Several women near the tomb (Matthew 28:9-10), Two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-32), Peter (Luke 24:33-35), Ten disciples in the upper room (Luke 24:36-43), Eleven disciples in the upper room (John 20:26-31), Seven men at the Sea of Galilee (John 21:1-25), Eleven disciples on a mountain (Matthew 28:16-20), The disciples near Bethany (Acts 1:9-12; Luke 24:52).

"presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by [the apostles] during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God"




5. His Apostles Were Dramatically Changed

After the resurrection the apostles said to the Jewish leaders, **"We ought to obey God rather than men**" (Acts 5:29). After they were beaten for disobeying the orders of the Jewish council, these once-cowardly apostles **"did not cease teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ**" (Acts 5:42).

Psalm 22 Predicted an afflicted one who would die a humiliating death by piercing of his hands and feet.

7. The Death and Resurrection was Clearly P<u>redicted</u>

Jesus Himself kept saying over and over that it was necessary for Him to go to Jerusalem to die and be resurrected from the dead on the third day (Matthew 9:15; 12:40; 16:21-23; 17:22-23; 20:17-19).

 Because there was no body in the grave.


 Because many people claimed to see Him alive.

So Why Should You Believe That Jesus Rose from the Dead?


 Because the apostles changed from confused wimps to courageous proclaimers.


In the early part of this century, a group of lawyers met in England to discuss the biblical accounts of Jesus' resurrection. They wanted to see if sufficient information was available to make a case that would hold up in an English court of law. When their study was completed, they published the results of their investigation. They concluded that Christ's resurrection was "one of the most wellestablished facts of history!"




"There are but two essential requirements when evaluating religions:

Has anyone cheated death and proved it? Is it available to me?


Here is the complete record: Confucius' tomb — occupied. Buddha's tomb — occupied. Mohammed's tomb — occupied. Jesus' tomb empty! Argue as you will, there is no point in following a dead man. You'll just end up like him.



But despite the fact that the resurrection is man's only hope for eternal life, the majority of people, including many who have studied it thoroughly, have rejected it. In doing so, they not only forfeit the future life but are left without true meaning or significance in the present life. Rejecting the resurrection is spiritual suicide.



Furthermore, denying the resurrection goes against the very grain of the human heart and soul. Solomon wrote that God "has also set eternity in their hearts" (Eccles. 3:11). Something within man is not satisfied with present earthly living. He instinctively reaches out for immortality, for a life that transcends his present life and that will continue after he dies.
